2 What financial support is available?

Waiver of student fees: Regular students are entitled to apply for a waiver of student fees if they are at least 50% disabled (as stated in their Disabled Persons Pass (Behindertenpass) issued by the Federal Social Office (Sozial-ministeriumservice)). Please apply for the waiver at the Registrar's Office. The Student's Union (ÖH) fee must be paid regardless.

Increased family allowance: The increased family allowance will be paid in addition to the normal family allowance. From July 2014 this additional sum is 150 euros per month. The relevant authority is the tax office at your place of residence. You find the relevant application form at www.help.gv.at or ask the contact at the Vice–Rectorate for Teaching and Promotion of Early Stage Artists/Researchers for a printed version.

Increased Federal Aid for Students: You can apply for the increased federal aid for students if you have a disability of 50% minimum. The amount of the increased federal aid for students depends on the seriousness of the impairment. Education benefit: The Federal Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Consumer Protection and its departments in the Austrian federal provinces grant an education benefit of up to 244 euros if specific requirements are fulfilled.

Personal assistance at the workplace/place of education (Persönliche Assistenz am Arbeits- und/oder Ausbildungsplatz, PAA): The Fonds Soziales Wien can grant a special aid called "Pflegegeldergänzungsleistung" for personal assistance. https://www.fsw.at/p/english. What are the rights of students with health problems?

Federal Act on the Organisation of Universities and their Studies (University Organization Act 2002) §2 (11) outlines special attention to be given to the needs of students with health problems as a task of the Austrian universities. This special attention applies to teaching, research, development and appreciation of the arts as well as to the infrastructure.

Alternative examination methods

According to § 59 (12), students with health problems have the right to ask for an alternative examination method, if the student can demonstrate that s(he) has suffered from a disability over a longer period of time and therefore cannot accomplish the examination by the method offered. Moreover, the alternative examination method must not impair the content and requirements of the exam.

Copyright Act (UrhG)

This act is important in terms of access to learning materials and the transfer of such materials into a more suitable format. The Copyright Act describes the right to duplicate and distribute learning materials in a suitable format for non-commercial use (§ 42d [1] UrhG). If you would like to record a course in audio or video format, please contact the teaching staff and provide them with your reasons. (please see § 66 [1] UrhG).

Federal Act on the Equal Rights of Persons with Disabilities (BGStG)

The Austrian Federal Act on the Equal Rights of Persons with Disabilities prohibits the discrimination of persons with disabilities. The universities have the responsibility to prevent and eliminate discrimination on the grounds of disability.
